Why do we need you?

- We need your help to transport our visually impaired members to, and from, clubs and support centre venues as detailed below:
- Kenilworth:
- 2nd Friday of the month to attend VSC session starts 9.30am and ends at 11.30am
- 2nd and 4th Tuesdays of the month to attend social club starts at 2.00pm and ends at 4.00pm
- Southam:
- 1st Tuesday PM of the month to attend VSC starts at 2.00 and ends at 3.30pm
- 3rd Wednesday of the month to attend social club starts at 2.00pm and ends at 3.30pm
- · Leamington:
- 1st and 3rd Wednesdays of the month to attend social club starts at 10.00am and ends at 12.00pm

What activities will I be involved in?

- Providing transport to, and from, the venue for our members
- Escorting members from the vehicle into the venue and ensuring they return home safely at the end of the session

What skills and abilities will I need to have?

- A full clean driving licence
- Access to a fully insured, taxed and MOTd vehicle
- Ability to escort a visually impaired person safely from your vehicle into the venue
- A good listener, sociable and friendly

How much time should I offer?

• This role requires you to try to be available when the club or centre you support is running so that our members can become familiar with you.

Is there an induction and training?

- · You will receive an induction when you start
- We will provide any training you need to complete the role

What on-going support/guidance will there be?

- You will be supported by our Community team
- Opportunities to meet and network with staff and fellow volunteers during the year

Will I need my own transport?

- · You will require your own transport.
- You will need to inform your insurer that you are a volunteer driver this does not usually increase the cost of insurance

What are the benefits to me?

- The opportunity of meeting new people and working as part of a dedicated team
- The satisfaction of knowing that you are making a vital difference to people living with sight loss

Will my expenses be paid?

 We pay volunteers "out-of-pocket" expenses for our support centres in accordance with our guidelines. Individual clubs determine whether they pay expenses.

Do I need to submit to a Disclosure and Barring Service check?

 As a volunteer working with vulnerable people you will need to undergo a DBS check in accordance with our policies
