Why do we need you?

- We need your help to run our Vision Support Centres across the county.
- Shipston 4th Tuesday afternoon of the month 1.30 4.30pm
- Rugby every Wednesday morning 9.00am 12.00pm
- Coleshill 2nd Thursday afternoon of the month 2.00pm 5.00pm
- Atherstone 3rd Friday morning of the month 9.00am 12.00pm
- Nuneaton every Thursday morning 9.00am 12.00pm
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What activities will I be involved in?

- Setting up the venue ready to welcome attendees
- Some volunteers are required to complete the register on a laptop taken to the session by a staff member.
- Guiding the attendees into the correct area and making them feel welcome
- Offering / making refreshments
- Offering advice and support to attendees as necessary supported by staff members who will be on site.
- Demonstrating equipment and explaining about local services

What skills and abilities will I need to have?

- A good listener, sociable and friendly
- Ability to share information accurately and the confidence to say you don't know the answer when appropriate
- Ability to prepare and serve refreshments
- Ability to work as a team to offer a friendly and welcoming experience

How much time should I offer?

• Our weekly Vision Support Centres require volunteers to attend from 9.00am to 12 noon on one day per week. Our monthly centres are either a morning or afternoon session. Ideally we would ask for a regular commitment

Is there an induction and training?

- You will receive an induction when you start
- We will provide any ongoing training you need to complete the role What on-going support/guidance will there be?
 - You will be supported by our Community team and have regular, in person contact with the staff running each centre
